



Program Notes

La Fiesta de la Posada

Dave Brubeck

The *Posada*, a custom depicting Joseph and Mary's search for lodging on the eve of her confinement, is re-enacted from December 16 to Christmas Eve throughout Latin America and in our own Southwest. Religious and secular traditions, never far apart in the lives of most Mexican villages, are at Christmas indefinably joined.

Details of *las posadas* may vary from region to region, but certain essentials remain wherever the custom is observed. Children, always an important part of the festivities, join with adults to form a torch and lantern procession and the streets become as crowded and bustling as ancient Bethlehem's at census time. Joseph leads a donkey, bearing a young girl dressed as The Virgin, or perhaps the children carry a litter of pine boughs which holds decorated clay figures of the Holy Family.

As the procession of villagers' winds through the streets singing litanies, they knock at various doors along the route. Each time they are turned away with the cruel words, "There is no room," until the procession arrives at the appointed home or church. Then, the doors are flung wide open in the spirit of Christmas and the celebration, with Mary as its central figure, begins. Guests kneel before *el nacimiento* (or, crèche), candles are lit, and the Christmas story is retold in song, dance, music and mime and The Christ Child is welcomed to earth. The unvarying finale of the celebration is the introduction of the piñata, a colorful, symbolically decorated figure of papier maché. The *piñata* is suspended above the heads of the children. Blindfolded and armed with long poles, youngsters vie for the honor of breaking the *piñata* and showering the contents of sweets and tiny gifts among all assembled.

I was born in a California town founded by the Spanish, raised on a cattle ranch that had been a Mexican land grant, and have absorbed and observed Mexican folk music all my life. As a musician, I have toured Mexico six times and always enjoyed listening to the folk music of the various regions. The ethnic music reflects those qualities I most admire in people... dignity in moments of tragedy, infectious high spirits in moments of joy, and an unshakeable religious faith made evident in a strong sense of one's own worth and a deep respect for the shared values of one's own group — family, church, and village. These qualities, I think, are universal to people with a strong communal sense — an increasingly rare attribute in urban culture. It is this sense of *sharing* in an event, which I have tried to capture in the simple retelling of the Christmas story.

The 16th Annual Welcome Christmas Carol Contest

Every December VocalEssence and the American Composers Forum celebrate the Christmas tradition in their own unique way: championing today's composers, exploring new works, and rediscovering lesser-known works of the past.

This year marks the sixteenth year of the **Welcome Christmas Carol Contest** as VocalEssence and the American Composers
Forum provide composers with the opportunity to compose a
modern-day carol. Open to composers of all ages, this year's contest
required writing a carol for SATB chorus accompanied by piano.

The two winners will each receive \$1,000, and the winning carols will be premiered at the December 7, 8, 13, 14 and 15, 2013 **Welcome Christmas** concerts featuring the VocalEssence Chorus & Ensemble Singers. The performances will be recorded for national broadcast in 2014 via American Public Media.

Composer's Note: Ring Out, Ye Bells! -By Dale Trumbore

In Paul Laurence Dunbar's text for Ring Out, Ye Bells!, the first three stanzas are populated by exclamations (and exclamation marks): calls to praise, to proclaim, to ring bells and sing of the birth of Christ. As I set this poem to music, though, I was struck by the shift in tone and punctuation of the fourth and fifth stanzas. Here, Dunbar gives us gentle and gorgeous imagery, as rocks and stones themselves sing sweetly. In contrast to the raised voices and bell-like piano accompaniment of the music prior, here the piano part ripples, and the voices of the choir are staggered in a gradual awakening. Finally, the music returns to the ringing bells and struck harps; the choir throws "all its power into singing!" and the song ends, triumphant.

Composer's Note: Sound Over All Waters -By William V. Malpede

The text of "Sound Over All Waters" is adapted from the poem, "A Christmas Carmen" by the American author, John Greenleaf Whittier. In Latin, "Carmen" translates to "song" or "poem." Mr. Whittier, who lived from 1807-1892, was known as an influential Quaker poet and an avid abolitionist, founding member of the American Anti-Slavery Society, and writer of the anti-slavery pamphlet, "Justice and Expediency." With some 18 volumes of poems to his credit, a number of his works have been adapted as hymns, "Sound Over All Waters" among them.

This text itself has numerous settings. I was inspired by its spirit of unity, love, freedom, and celebration of song in announcing Jesus' birth, to compose a piece that employs some element of contemporary popular dance rhythms. The "strophic" element of the poem is reflected in the first two verses, each line opening with a pyramid-chord in the choir. The keyboard accompaniment

is both syncopated, and steadily propulsive. After the verses, the dance-ostinato rhythm then begins in the chant-like reading of "With glad jubilations, bring hope to the nations!" This section is then interrupted by the slow, somewhat ethereal reading of "The dark night is ending, and dawn has begun." Upon this realization, we return to a repeat of the A section (first verse). The piece closes with a brief return to the chant, coupled with the harmony from the ethereal section, and finally a joyous fortissimo on "all (hearts) beat as one!" I decided to write the last chord not a unison note, but rather a rich layered chord to reflect all varied cultures and peoples joined together.

The piece tells of the coming of Christ as a time heralding the clasping of hands, the end of the dark night, and the long quarrel ceasing. I believe the heart of the text is timely today, and hopefully the mix of energetic syncopation with some of the dramatic dissonances will be enjoyed by the listener.

Biographies



Jazz legend **Dave Brubeck** (1920-2012) was equally distinguished as both composer and pianist. He studied at the College of the Pacific and at Mills College, which led to

the founding of the experimental Jazz Workshop Ensemble. And, in the Dave Brubeck Quartet, its experimentation with time signatures unusual to jazz produced works like Blue Rondo a la *Turk* and *Take Five*, introducing millions of young listeners to jazz. Brubeck composed and recorded several largescale works including two ballets, a musical, an oratorio, four cantatas, a mass, works for jazz combo and orchestra, and many solo piano pieces. In February of 1975, Dave made his first appearance with the VocalEssence Chorus performing his "Light in the Wilderness" oratorio at Central Lutheran Church and a few years later he returned to perform the local premiere of his Pange Lingua Mass with VocalEssence. For his last visit to Minneapolis, he performed at the Dakota Jazz Club (age 89). Dave performed at the White House in 1964 and 1981 and at the 1988 Moscow Summit honoring the Gorbachevs. His many awards include the BMI Jazz Pioneer Award, a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award, and a 2009 Kennedy Center Award. VocalEssence is proud to have had Dave as one of our Honorary Directors.



Pianist, accordionist and occasional storyteller **Dan Chouinard** is a Minneapolis native who plays, tours and records regularly with an ever-expanding roster of musicians

and writers. Dan grew up in a musical family, attended St. John's University and spent four years as a teacher of French and Italian at the University of Minnesota. He regularly creates special programs blending storytelling, interviews and music, many of these for Minnesota Public Radio. He has been

heard on "A Prairie Home Companion" with Garrison Keillor, and served as rehearsal accompanist to Meryl Streep, Lily Tomlin and Lindsay Lohan on the set of the Robert Altman-directed movie *A Prairie Home Companion*. He was featured with VocalEssence in 2000 when Brubeck's *La Fiesta de la Posada* was first performed.



Mariachi Mi Tierra is the oldest Mariachi ensemble in the Twin Cities. Rosalio Castro, who formed the group in 2003, has been playing various Mexican styles of music since he was in his teens. Most of the members of Mariachi Mi Tierra have brought a great number of regional and current favorite tunes into the group's repertoire. In addition to events in the local Mexican community, "Mariachi Mi Tierra" also plays at schools, colleges, businesses, casinos, and festivals.

We raise up talented choral leaders as models in our school communities by awarding them for groundbreaking work. And, our board of directors has defined it as a priority for VocalEssence in our strategic plan: Strengthening the field of music education.

Choral Music Education: Strengthening the field of music education

There is a troubling decline in choral singing opportunities for children in Minnesota. From 2000-2010, music education specialists in Minnesota public schools have been cut by 28%, which has resulted in:

- Substantial reduction in elementary choral and general music programs
- Decreased contact time for music classes (once every five to six days) and/or doubled-up classes.
- Music programs increasingly only available for more affluent students
- Further compounding the music education climate, 37% of Minnesota's public school students live at or near poverty. These students and families typically aren't able to participate in after-school activities including choirs, lessons and other music opportunities.

In spite of these sobering statistics, we have rich empirical evidence of the impact of choral singing on student achievement rates, and its ability to build characteristics that make them remarkably good citizens.





The Mission of VocalEssence

VocalEssence champions choral music of all genres, celebrating the vocal experience through innovative concerts, commissions, and community engagement programs.

VocalEssence is renowned for its innovative exploration of music for voices and instruments under the enthusiastic direction of Artistic Director and Founder Philip Brunelle. Each season, VocalEssence presents an eclectic series of concerts featuring the 100-voice VocalEssence Chorus, the 32-voice professional Ensemble Singers, and an array of guest soloists and instrumentalists.

VocalEssence was founded in 1969 as the Plymouth Music Series, an arts outreach program of Plymouth Congregational Church in Minneapolis and incorporated as a separate 501(c)(3) non-profit in 1979. In 2002, the Plymouth Music Series changed its name to VocalEssence, capturing the essence of its mission to explore music for the human voice, from the spoken word to choral singing.

In addition to championing lesser-known works of the past, VocalEssence has an unwavering commitment to today's composers, which has resulted in more than 160 world premieres to date. The organization has received the ASCAP/Chorus America Award for Adventurous Programming of Contemporary Music six times and has been honored with more Chorus America awards than any other ensemble nationwide, including the oncein-an-organizational-lifetime Margaret Hillis Achievement Award for Choral Excellence.

Beyond its work in performances and recordings of choral music, VocalEssence reaches into the community with programs that impact thousands of students, singers and composers every year. WITNESS celebrates the contributions of African Americans to our shared American heritage through concerts, recordings and comprehensive school programs. ¡Cantaré! brings the talents of composers from Mexico directly into Minnesota classrooms. VocalEssence partners with American Composers Forum to offer the annual Welcome Christmas Carol Contest.

Philip Brunelle

Artistic Director and Founder



Philip Brunelle, artistic director and founder of VocalEssence, is an internationally renowned conductor, choral scholar and performer.

Believing that listeners and musicians alike must experience music of many genres and styles, he has worked enthusiastically — and tirelessly — to expand audiences for rarely heard works of the past and worthwhile new music. In addition, to date VocalEssence has commissioned more than 160 works. Philip has conducted symphonies (New York Philharmonic, Seattle Symphony, and Minnesota Orchestra among others) as well as choral festivals and operas on six continents.

Over the past decade Philip has been deeply involved with the International Federation of Choral Music (IFCM). He served as president of the Sixth World Symposium on Choral Music held in Minneapolis (2002), was on the Artistic Committee for the Eighth Symposium, held in Denmark (2008), and the Ninth Symposium, held in Argentina (2011). He is a Vice President of the IFCM Board and is now serving as Executive Director for the 2014 World Choral Symposium to be held in Seoul, South Korea.

Philip holds five honorary doctorates, was invested as an Honorary Member of the Order from the British Empire (MBE) in 2005 for his services to music, and was awarded Commander of the Royal Norwegian Order of Merit in 2007. He has also been honored by the governments of Sweden, Hungary, and Mexico.

As the associate conductor of VocalEssence, Sigrid Johnson is affectionately known as "Ears" — for her unique skill in helping develop the choral blend and balance that give the VocalEssence Chorus & Ensemble Singers their signature sound. She provides expert input in the selection of repertoire and assists throughout the audition process. Her ability to achieve excellence in choral blend and intonation is a priceless asset to VocalEssence.

Sigrid is a member of the voice and choral faculty of St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota, and the conductor of the Manitou Singers, St. Olaf's 100-voice first-year women's chorus. She maintains an active schedule as a guest conductor and clinician at choral festivals, workshops and all-state music festivals across the country. She is known internationally for her work with musicians at all levels, having conducted workshops in Australia, the Netherlands, Sweden and Finland. In August 2008, Sigrid was one of the featured lecturers for the Eighth World Symposium on Choral Music in Copenhagen; in 2011, she was featured in the Ninth World Symposium in Argentina.



Donor Spotlight: Mike and Donna Wolsted

Music Producers Helping Engineer a Strong Choral Community



Mike and Donna Wolsted have been a part of the choral music community for years. They are truly choral music producers who have helped engineer the success of the choral community in Minnesota, as part of the strong choral cultures created by dedicated people from F. Melius Christiansen of St. Olaf College to our own Philip Brunelle of VocalEssence. And, due to their work and dedication, they've helped increase the prestige of Minnesotan choral music. "Whenever I travel, I am always reminded about how truly blessed we are in Minnesota," Mike said, "It's hard to find another state that has the breadth. depth and dedication to the choral arts."

Both Mike and Donna grew up in choral communities in Minnesota. In their hometowns of Harmony and Rochester, they sang in choirs — Donna as soprano and Mike as bass. But their voices didn't collide until they met at a college radio

station; it was then that they found sweet harmony. "He was going to make his money in radio," Donna said, "I was going to make mine working at the Mayo Clinic."

While they treasured Rochester, their love of music eventually drew them to the big city lights of Minneapolis, where Mike became engrossed in music producing and engineering. He worked at Sound 80, a recording studio that existed before MPR, as a producer, and created its first digital choral album. "He was always recording, listening and editing music. He was dedicated to the sound," Donna said. "But even with that love of music, after listening to track after track, we never sat down to listen to recordings — we always sought out live music."

From marimba bands in Mexico who played classical music to their favorite choirs in Minnesota, Mike and Donna tirelessly seek out live music — with good

reason. "Nowadays, it's even more important to find the thrill of listening to live music," Mike said. "When you can easily bend pitch of singers in recording studio, only live performances show the talent, the craft and the spontaneity of music."

Through a spontaneous meeting with Philip via mutual friends in the choral community, they saw the work that Vocal-Essence was doing in outreach programs, spreading choral culture and creating community, and decided to get involved.

"Our schools are losing funds for music," said Mike. "Programs are losing their focus and turning to simple pop music lessons. We need to challenge them musically." ¡Cantaré!, a VocalEssence composer-in-residence program in Twin Cities elementary and high schools, does just that by bringing world renowned classical composers from Mexico to write music for more than 400 students that is performed at a free concert each spring.

Mike and Donna support ¡Cantaré! to ensure the strength of the choral community long into the future. "We need to broaden our focus to encompass everyone," Donna said. "And, as always, we need to get them when they are young." Thank you, Mike and Donna, for supporting choral music in our community!
