

2014-2015 WITNESS Evaluation Highlights

Students demonstrate progress in meeting Minnesota education standards

- Nearly 80% of artists felt that teachers remained in the classroom and were engaged in the workshop, which is a moderating factor for this program goal
- 91% of artists felt that all or most of the students were engaged during the artist workshops.

Students demonstrate increased tolerance and understanding of diversity

- Nearly 80% of artists felt that teachers remained in the classroom and were engaged in the workshop, which is a moderating factor for this program goal
- 91% of artists felt that all or most of the students were engaged during the artist workshops.
- 85% of artists felt that all or most students increased their understanding of tolerance and diversity.

"Participating in the WITNESS program is a fantastic experience for our students. Not only do they broaden their understanding of African American culture, but they get a chance to attend a wonderful concert at Orchestra Hall and work with exceptional Artists-in-Residence. Students build self-esteem through positive role models

- 91% of artists felt that all or most of the students were engaged during the artist workshops.
- 96% of teachers felt that the artist was a positive role model for their students.

"After I introduced myself to the students, I asked that we go around the circle and they each give their name and something they know about MLK. The first boy right next to me was "shy" and other students stated that he was - he didn't even want to give his name out loud. Students demonstrate awareness of African American contributions to the arts

- 77% of artists felt that all or most students showed an increased level of knowledge of the contributions of African Americans to our shared American cultural heritage.
- Prior to the artist workshops, 34% of teachers rated their students' level of knowledge of African American culture to our shared American cultural heritage as **excellent**. After the artists workshops, that figure rose to 85%.

Students demonstrate understanding of the program theme

• 89% of artists felt that all or most students were introduced to the artists, the WITNESS School Program and/or the WITNESS theme **before** the first workshop.

- 97% of artists felt that all or most students showed an increased level of knowledge or excitement for the WITNESS theme **after** the artist workshops.
- 94% of teachers strongly agreed that the artist workshops highlighted the WITNESS program theme of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., nonviolent resistance and the music of Sounds of Blackness, and that they effectively provided students with new enthusiasm for the subject.

"Everything was tied in very well from the lessons in the Teacher Resource Guide to the Teaching Artists to the concert. The classroom teachers were thankful for the opportunity to expand on their lessons in social studies and reading, and I was grateful for an opportunity (in music class) to expose the students to how music relates to history and culture. 2014-2015 Facts and Figures

- 5,292 students (grades K and 2-12) from 49 schools (18 urban, 24 suburban and 7 rural) from the Twin Cities metro area participated in the WITNESS School Program.
- 24 of all public WITNESS Partner Schools have more than 50% of students who are eligible for free and reduced lunch.
- Nearly half of schools who participated in the WITNESS School Program, report a more than 50% nonwhite student body.
- Almost half of students from participating in the WITNESS School Program are nonwhite.
- 82% of teachers used the WITNESS Teacher Resource Guide in their classroom and 91% rated it as very effective in helping the to prepare students for the artist workshops.
- 88% of teachers rated the overall experience of the Young People's Concert as "excellent."
- 71% of teachers reported that their students attend the WITNESS Young People's Concert annually.
- The top two reasons why teachers decide to bring their students to the WITNESS Young People's Concert are the Concert Theme (i.e. Martin Luther King, Jr., Gullah, Marian Anderson, Duke Ellington, etc.) and the Celebration of African American culture.
- 92% of teachers rated the overall WITNESS School Program experience as excellent.
